	Vyakarana(Grammar), Sahitya(Literature), NavyaNyaya(Indian Logic), Darshan(Philosophy), Puranas(Mythology), JyotishShastra(Astrology & Astronomy) and Dharmashastra(Theology) are taught in various classes at the Sri Sadashiv campus of the Central Sanskrit University in Puri, Odisha. In literature, there are rare works such as Natyashastra, Raghuvansha and Meghadoot. This provides an introduction to poetry and poetics. The Raghuvansha provides an understanding of moral, religious and cultural values and an introduction to the art of theater through learning of Natya Shastra. The study of the Puranas, Mahabharata, Srimad Bhagavatam and Vishnu Puranas develops the qualities of sacrifice, love, devotion, faith and goodness. In the subject of Vyakaran(grammar), texts such as Praudhamanorama Vyakaransiddhantakaumudi, laghushabdendushekhar, paramalaghumanjusha, mahabhashya are taught. Studying Vyakarana develops language skills, eloquence and sementic skill in students. With proficiency in Sanskrit, one becomes proficient in other languages as well. Sanskrit grammar scientifically corrects words, sentences and language. In philosophy, one practices the rare texts such as the Sankhya- karika-tarka-sangraha, the Nyaya-siddhanta-muktavali, the Brahma-sutra, the Shankara-bhashya, the Yoga-sutra, and the Srimad-Bhagavad-gita. This increases the student's knowledge of the philosophy. The understanding of the Purusha and Prakriti of Sankhya can be seen to be logical in the process of creation of the Puranas. Knowledge of the qualities

	of Sottyp(goodpoop) Reign(poppiop) and Tamon(ignorance) developed			
	of Sattva(goodness), Rajas(passion) and Tamas(ignorance) develops intelligence.			
	The practice of philosophy is associated with modern			
	psychology. In astrology, rare texts such as Muhurtachintamani,			
	Jatakalankara, Brihatsamhita, Jatakaparijata, Manasagari			
	Jatakalankara, Brihatsamhita, Jatakaparijata, Manasagari and Hastasanjivani are practiced. Planets and sub planates have an influence

QI The Central Sanskrit University includes inclusion in the curriculum to avoid conflicting parts. Just as men are not the only ones who have the right to choose a bride for marriage from the point of view of equality, a bride also gets her desired husband through swayamvara. In Abhijnana Shakuntala, Shakuntala chooses Dushyanta and Maharshi Kanva accept her Gandharva Vivah(Love Marrige). The Champoo Ramayana contains a refrence about the Sita's self-marriage(Swyamvara).

The Uttarārāmacharita describes the happy married life of Sītā and Rāma. There was also education for women. Like men, women had shown artistic skills. The Naishadhiyacharit describes Damayanti's skill in painting. The Vedic Suktas contain praises of the gods and goddesses. There is a character of Radha in Puranas, who is reputed as a symbol of love. There is a paper on environment in the Shastri class. This creates awareness of the environment among the students. In the play AbhijnanaShakuntala, Shakuntala and others plant trees and irrigate them. It points and condemns the cutting of trees for material prosperity. In the UttaraRamaCharit the poet describes the gentle and terrible forms of nature This description indicates man's love for the environment. The Purāņas describe kindness with animals through the incident of the liberation of the elephant. The Purāņas describe the origin of creation from water. Thus, we also have a moral duty towards them, which is indicated through the course of study.

Subjects like Vedic philosophy, Puranas and literature etc are taught to promote and protect human values. Srimad Bhagavad Gita, Vishnu Purana, Bhagavat Purana, Ramayana, Mahabharata and Champoo Ramayana are taught. Those texts teach sense of duty , human values of Indian culture, love, royalty , morality, compassion, devotion , and character building. By practicing the texts such as the Nyayasiddhantamuktavali, the Brahmasūtra, the Śāṅkarabhashya and the Yogasūtra, one avoids the dualities that arise in the mind, purifies the mind and develops logical power. By practicing the Bhagavad Purāṇa, the mind is relieved of its disturbances. Reading the characters of Lord Kṛṣṇa inspires devotion in the mind. There is always awareness of the pervasiveness of the Supreme Soul. By the power of the Sattvic mode of emotion, the dualities in the mind are relieved. Practicing the Mahabharata provides instruction for avoiding conflicting emotions. There are people in society who have bad thoughts like the Kauravas and people who have good thoughts like the Pāṇḍavas. Guidance is available on how to deal with those people. The Vedic peace mantras demonstrate equality. In the Department of Dharm Shastra, Kautilya's Arthashastra is also taught.

This develops leadership qualities. The Shanti Parva of the Mahabharata describes the duties of a king. The practice of these teaches true self-respect, knowledge, leadership and morality. Students read classical texts of poetry to learn the essence of poetry for the skill of creating poetry in order to express the inner sensitivity of man. For example, the Abhijnana Shakuntala is read to reveal one's emotional sensations. Through Srimad Bhagavatam, students get the taste of devotion, know the mystry of Krishna, lives the life of devotees like Ambarish and gain mental strength, faith and confidence.

This is the oldest and largest campus of the Central Sanskrit University in Puri. There is a finance department to monitor the income and expenditure of the campus. Effective monitoring of finances, income and expenditure is carried out on an ongoing basis under the leadership of the campus respected Directors and Section Officers. Furthermore, the Procurement Committee and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell also periodically inspect and test financial resources in accordance with regulatory guidelines. Similarly, internal and external audits of financial income and expenditure of campus finance are conducted.

### 1. Details of External Audit –

Annual external audit of budget and expenditure related to finance of the campus is prescribed by the Accountant General of Odisha (AG Odisha). and the operation of adequate financial resources is tested. There is 100% audit of income and expenditure The Campus Finance Department prescribes the audit of each payment during the audit period in accordance with the rules of each year. However, in addition to this, the truth is checked in relation to any associated file during the audit.

### 2. Internal Audit Statement –

The internal audit of the budget, expenditure and financial transactions of the campus is undertaken by the Central Sanskrit University team (Team comprising of university) and other campus experts. The campus prepares a Description of Expenditure every month and sends a copy to the university headquarters. The details of that are submitted to the Finance Committee for approval.

## 3. The Context

What were the contextual features or challenging issues that needed to be addressed in designing and implementing this practice (in about 150 words) ?

In ancient time Educational Institutions were very famous and honoured for their traditional teaching and learning process, which were humbly called Guru - ShishyaParampra. To indicate this ancient tradition there was one more very reputed word "Sampradaya". Due to these Parampara or Sampradaya we got very unique status of World - Teacher (Vishva - Guru) unanimously in all over the world. It is also well - known fact that so many world class scholars visited India to get ultimate and rich knowledge of Upanishads, Vedas and different sections of Indian Philosophies. Without any break, this tradition is facilitating our Shastric Studies officially through the Central Sanskrit University and government approved Sansthan established in different part of the state. Apart from these central and state level institutions India has so many private institutions which are following strictly their particular Sampradaya and Guru Shishyaparampara thoroughly to protect Shastric knowledge. The pass out students of these Pathasalas are admitted in our Prakshastri (+2) & Shastri (+3) courses of Campus. Finally they admitted to Acharya(M.A) and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D) courses . India is recongnised for two major aspects - Sanskrit and Culture . This Campus aims at the fulfilment these main aspects .

## 4. The Practice

Describe the practice and its uniqueness in the context of India higher education. What were the constraints / limitations, if any, faced (in about 400 words) ?

Protection and preservation of this Guru - Shishya (tradition) is itself

a challenging job in the present materialistic society . This practice may be traced back to ancient Gurukulasdeveloped during the period of Vashishtha, Sandipani and Kanva . Most of the Sanskrit Universities and colleges are rigorously following this tradition. If the Shastras are protected, then its credit goes to these incredible Indian *Guru - ShishyaParampara* only. In all over India, there are so many living Gurukulas where students are learning Shastras from very early age. There are Sanskrit Pathashaalas where the students are getting admissions at early age to study different Shastras traditionally from eighth class. All these *Gurukulas* and *Pathashaalas* are in fact feeders of our Sanskrit institutions for Higher Education.

For the benefit of the teachers, we are strictly following the U.G.C. norms of Career Advancement Scheme. We have adopted an institution friendly and pro teacher approach to administration for which we are interacting with the faculties of different departments and trying to solve their problems at our level. Apart from this, we have formed different Committees for good governance and better interaction and our achievement in this direction is quite spectacular. We have to create many mile stones in the path of progress to promote Sanskrit which is considered as the hidden treasure buried under heaps of rubbish.

The syllabus and curriculum designed by this University are mainly based on Sanskrit learning and job oriented. It is also felt that Sanskrit is nearer to the Computer and closer to Management, Human Resources Development and Medicine. The aim of Sansthan is to link Sanskrit with modern technology so that the Sciences of Charaka, Shusruta, Chanakya, Bharadvaja and Barahamihira come out for the welfare of the human society.

In addition to Science and Technology, we have achieved many more with regard to financial development for mundane pleasure. This growth is unhealthy and stays away from peace and tranquillity. Sanskrit provides peace and satisfaction to the human being. It is felt that foreigners being tired of living with materialism have accepted the Indian way of life.

The eighth schedule of Indian constitution envisages the importance of Sanskrit language. After independence, for the promotion and propagation of this language, Govt. of India established Sanskrit Commission in 1956 under the Chairmanship of Sri Suniti Kumar Chatterjee. On its recommendations, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and State Sanskrit Academies were established having momentum in achieving the goal. The campus is taken over by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan and the erstwhile ShriSadashiva College was renamed as ShriSadshivaKendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Puri and subsequently declared as deemed to University on 7.5.2002 and ever since it is progressing in all dimensions achieving its multifarious objectives.

- 7. Women's Empowerment Cell to inculcate a consciousness among them for Sanskrit learning and also to enable themselves for fighting against social injustice inflicted here & there upon them.

The Campus is facing a lot of problems as there is less number of supporting Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff to run the administrative office as well as teaching Departments. As result of which teaching and office works affected the normal academic growth of the campus.

Large buildings have been constructed in the campus getting financial assistance from the MOE, GOI. A multi purpose Hall, Admin block, 2 block are a bare necessity. For its maintenance, repair and renovation no maintenance wing has yet been established. The University being situated near by sea shore, the buildings suffer deterioration due to saline climate which needs immediate and timely repair and maintenance. The University is six kms. away from the District Head quarter Hospital, Puri. Where as no fee medical facilities in near by areas are available. The Health Centre of the Campus is having only one part time Doctor and at times it creates problem on his part to cater to the needs of the students.

Though there is standard Library Building, but lack of adequate staff text books, reference books, journals the teachers and students are not getting the benefit as they should.

The Campus monitor its target and results as per programme of the academic calendar. The Heads of the Departments are accountable to monitor the performance of the department to achieve the target

setforth. The IQAC is also monitoring the progress of teaching learning facility apart from feedback received from students. The growing intake of the students in different course and also introduction of new specialized branches of studies reveal that academic programmes are running properly. The results framework documents prepared annually and monitored to ensure that the targets and benchmarks are achieved.

The Campus also have implemented various directives issued by the Ministry based on the recommendations of the Administrative Reform Commission and other higher bodies to set the system in the proper mode of functioning. Introduction of The Central Evaluation System has facilitated the functioning of the Campus very effectively in terms of timely publication of results. Pass out students of this campus are mainly engaged as Sanskrit Teacher in the state and out of the state .Besides , many of them have been engaged in Karmakanda . Priest in the temples , Police and Public Services

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

There are some branches of higher studies in Sanskrit Shastraic where opportunities of employment are yet to be generated. Under the circumstances, the teaching of the Sanskrit Shastras requires inter - disciplinary approach and comparative discourse with other valuable literatures available in Tibbetan, Mangolian, Chinese, Pali, Prakrit languages. Further, a comprehensive policy should be framed for teaching of Sanskrit language, literature and shastras in secondary and higher secondary level at government and non government institutions to ensure availability of students for higher studies. Apart from these constraints, efforts should also be made to create job opportunities for the students of Sanskrit .It has also been observed that in the name of tradition priests are practicing without having adequate knowledge of shastras. This results in propagation of superstition as well as declining of faith in the conventional tradition and their wisdom. This should not be encouraged in the society. There should be a monitoring body for such practices as has been done in case practicing Ayurveda.

As there is less job opportunity in Sanskrit, students are attracted towards science and IT streams. After education they are going to abroad resulting in brain drain in the country. The ancient lore i.e. archery, music, dance, agriculture, administration and cultivation as mentioned in Kautilya'sArthashastra should be included to the syllabic of Sanskrit Universities . To adopt modern technology, We are also shortly introducing choice based credit system.
